Magic Story Starters guides students through increasingly challenging writing activities. Students first work on lessons that provide vocabulary words and illustrations to kick off the writing process. The lessons evolve in the following sections, as students are offered single sentences and asked to fill in the missing story. Finally, illustrations alone are provided in order to elicit more complex creative thinking. The progressive nature of the writing activities allows students, teachers, and parents to assess children's growth and progress as evolving writers.
